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Here in northeastern Connecticut's Quiet Corner there are many opportunities to combine a love of cycling with some sight-seeing. Choose a route described in this guide and enjoy lovely views of pastures, cornfields and some of the few remaining dairy farms in Connecticut.

These routes also take you through some of the historic villages settled in the 1700s, including routes along rivers that once fueled grist mills and saw mills.

The terrain can be a bit challenging - from roller coaster hills to busy intersections - so we suggest you allow enough time to pace yourself and to stop along the way to explore historic cemeteries, museums and churches, grab a bite to eat, or snap a few photographs to preserve memories of your visit.
